Annual Report July 2023

Following the review (Jan 2023) of the Scheme of Delegation by the Trustees of Unity Education Trust, the core responsibilities of Academy Stakeholder Committees are identified as follows:

- that pupils are listened to, feel safe in the school and are successful learners**
- that parents and carers are kept informed about their child's progress and that any concerns they have are listened and responded to**
- that effective arrangements are in place for staff wellbeing**
- that there is regular communication with parents and the wider community**
- that examples of the activities of the school and the ASC are provided to the Trust for its termly newsletter to all stakeholders**



<b>ASC membership and meetings</b>	<p>Beeston Primary School ASC currently (July 2023) has 6 members comprising:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>1 Executive Headteacher</li><li>2 co-opted governors</li><li>1 staff governor</li><li>2 parent governors</li></ul> <p>There is a chair of governors. Only hearings or appeals are delegated to sub-committees.</p> <p>Beeston Primary School ASC came into being on 6 March 2023 and has met 3 times since.</p>

<p><b>The work that we have done in our Academy Stakeholder Committee</b></p>	<p>The ASC met three times during the Spring and Summer Terms. and has A community governor with education experience, Mandy Hall, has been appointed and an elections process for a staff governor resulted in the re-appointment of Louise Snell.</p> <p>The ASC has developed effective links with the local community with regard to road safety issues, liaising with Parish and County Councils to improve road safety for both the school and village.</p> <p>The ASC considered the responses to the staff well-being survey, Jan 2022, and to the parental survey, January 2023. Additionally they received the results of the pupil survey undertaken in October 2022 and followed this up with small group discussions with some pupils in the Summer term.</p> <p>The ASC received a presentation on the UET School Pledges initiative and how it has been tailored to suit the needs of the School. This presentation was followed up by governor visits to the school to speak with pupils to gain their feedback on the Pledges.</p> <p>Governors liaise with FOBs, the friends association, with two governors on the Committee.</p> <p>Governors have attended sports day and accompanied pupils on school trips and outings, including to Whittlingham, West Stowe and Sandringham.</p> <p>The ASC were immensely proud of:-</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. the liaison with the Parish Council which has resulted in the siting of Sam2 signs in the village, and the appointment of one of the school governors to the Parish Council. Additionally, the new community governor is also a member of the Parish Council.</li> <li>2. the engagement between pupils and governors to learn first hand what pupils think of Beeston school</li> <li>3. the successful retention and recruitment of governors, and succession planning for Chair</li> <li>4. high levels of attendance, enthusiasm and engagement from all the members of the ASC, including assisting UET and other schools with Panels.</li> </ol>

<b>Future plans for our ASC</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The ASC plan to recruit an additional community member, to ensure continued effectiveness and engagement with stakeholders</li> <li>• To continue to engage with the wider parent body; at the school gate, engaging with FOBs, etc. Additionally it is hoped to create opportunities for parents to meet governors over a cup of tea.</li> <li>• To continue to engage directly with pupils to learn their views, specifically with regard to arrangements for lunch times.</li> <li>• To receive the results of the staff well being survey and continue to have interest in staff well being</li> </ul>
